- Advocate for investments that enhance the health of women and babies
- Promote collective action to support parents and health professionals providing critical care
- Offer valuable health information related to pregnancy, childbirth, and the postnatal period

- Increased global awareness and advocacy for maternal and child health issues.
- Strengthened political commitment and policy changes to support health initiatives.
- Improved access to quality maternal and child health services, especially in underserved areas.
- Enhanced community engagement and public participation in health improvement efforts.
